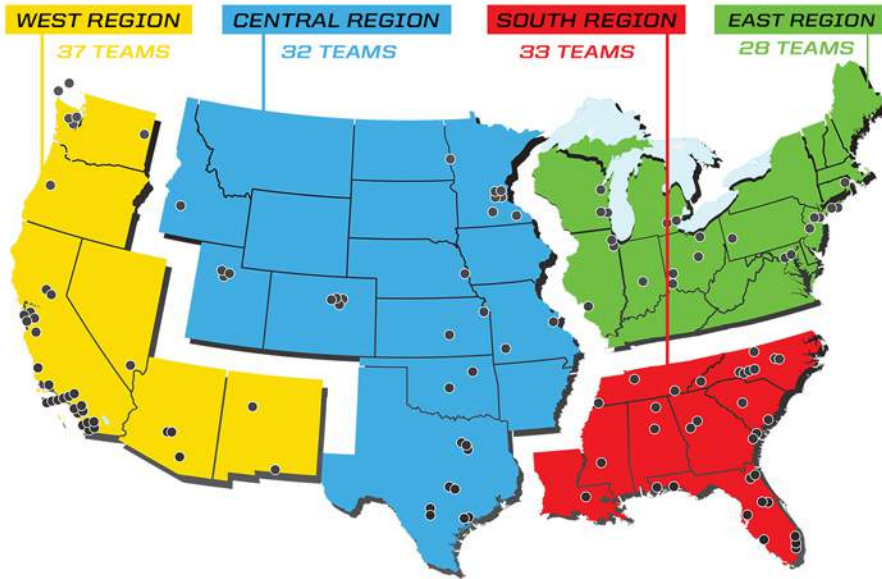

The Women's Premier Soccer League, in its 23rd season, has grown to 130 clubs making it the Largest Women's Soccer League in the World. Team Rosters consist of highly skilled players from collegiate, post-collegiate, international and prep pedigrees.



The WPSL is sanctioned by the United States Adult Soccer Association (USASA), which is an affiliate of the United States Soccer Federation (USSF).

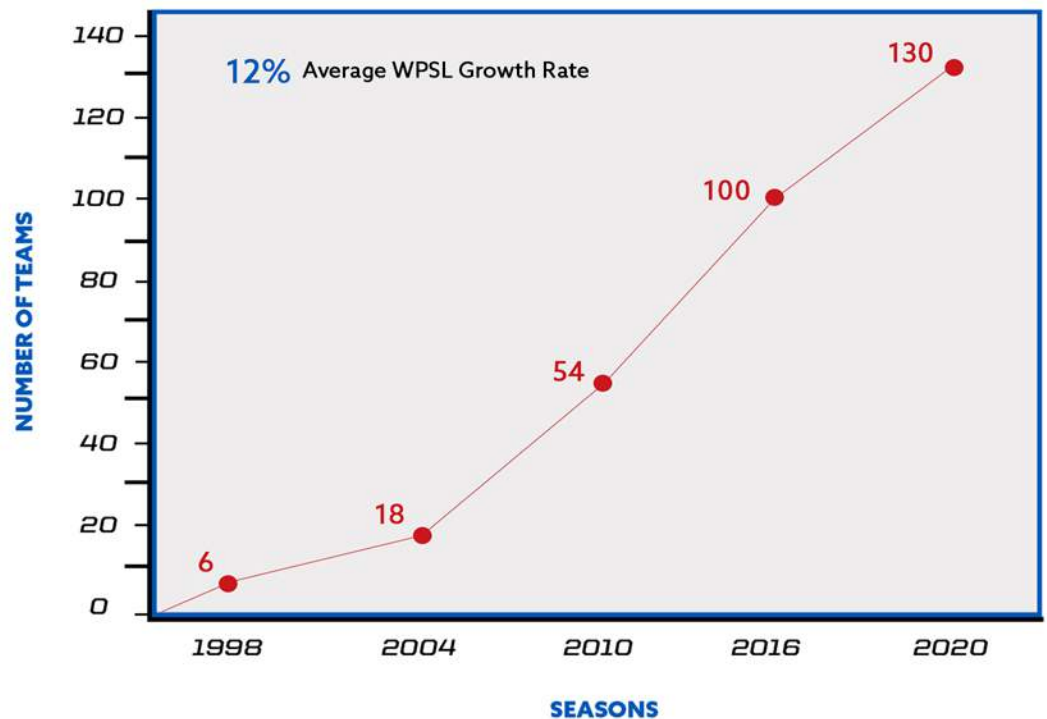

LEAGUE GROWTH

The WPSL has grown at an average of 12% since its inaugural season in 1998. The league has seen its Roster of Teams increase in 21 of its 23-season history – a *consistent trend rarely achieved in team sports*.

MARQUEE ALUMNAE

Entering its 23rd season, the Women's Premier Soccer League has provided thousands of elite female players with the opportunity to grow and continually develop their game to take them to the next level. As a result, the WPSL has produced an impressive resume of Marquee Alumnae who have gone on to play professionally both stateside and internationally, as well as earning National Team Honors on FIFA World Cup and Olympic stages.

As many still play in the National Women's Soccer League and internationally, those who have retired from the game have continued earning accomplishments such as turning to coaching, sports broadcasting, and even making the *New York Times* Best Sellers List. In 2019, Brandi Chastain and Leslie Osborne both joined the California Storm's Board of Directors - the team the duo both played for during their time in the WPSL.

Additional notable individual honors include Brandi Chastain's 2017 Hall of Fame induction and 2019 Ballon d'Or winner, Megan Rapinoe - only the second female to win the award.

BALTIMORE 2020

The 2020 NWSL College Draft featured 17 WPSL players among the 36 draft selections, including three WPSL standouts among the first 10 selections. Forward Morgan Weaver of the Seattle Sounders Women was the No. 2 pick by Portland Thorns FC, and was followed by two selections from the Orlando Pride, both Motor City FC products – No. 3 pick, midfielder Taylor Korneick, and with the No. 7 selection, Orlando selected defender Courtney Petersen. Eleven different WPSL clubs had players selected in the '19 Draft, as Motor City FC, the Seattle Sounders and Washington Spirit Reserves led the way with three former player's picked, respectively.
